Songkhla Shelter for Men


Currently, there are

9 main shelters (4 for men,
4 for women and 1 for boys)
provide food, medical care, psychosocial recovery, legal aid, life skills & vocational training, repatriation and reintegration

There are **76** temporary shelters located nationwide

#### Protection and Services Provision





Intake / Reception (on-duty staff)

Check the residents' belongings

Scan the residents' external health

Brief the residents about shelter's rules


#### Orientation


(social worker / psychologist)

Inform the residents' right

Support the residents' confidence

Reduce the residents' tension





#### Accommodation

- Shelters provide the dormitories with personal bedding, clothes and articles.
- Meals served 3 times daily.

# Counseling

- Social worker interview to conduct family, legal assistance and bio-social assessment.
- Psychologist psycho-social counseling, EQ,
   IQ and AQ testing.

#### Education

- Non-formal education prescribed by Ministry of Education.
- Peer-to-peer education by residents.
- Computer training, English course, etc by NGOs.
- Life-long education.

# Vocational Training

 Vocational training courses offer to residents according to their own interests and skills.

#### Medical Care

- 24 hours in-house medical care unit by nurse.
- Referral to hospital in case of emergency or further treatment.
- Check-up the residents health by external doctor twice a month.

# Legal Assistance

- Coordinate to Ministry of Labor to request wages and compensation.
- Accompany the residents to participate the investigation of legal proceedings.
- Request compensation from Ministry of Justice according to Criminal Act.

### Social Activities

- Reduce tension of the residents to adapt themselves to new environment.
- Enjoy participating in festive activities.
- Support the residents life skills.

## Repatriation

- Accompany the returnees home.
- Coordinate involved agencies to arrange the process.

### Follow Up

 Collaborate with local agencies in conducting monitoring and providing continuing assistance.
